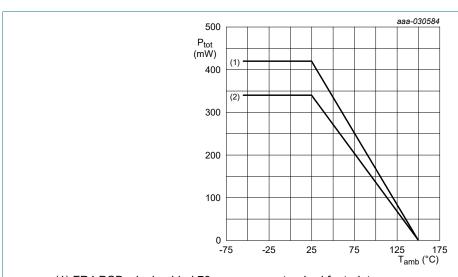

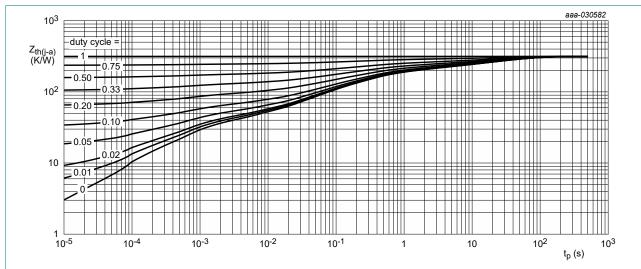
Fig. 1. Power derating curves DFN1110D-3 (SOT8015)

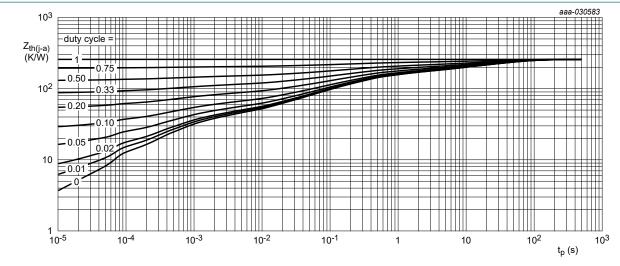

FR4 PCB; single-sided 70 µm copper, standard footprint

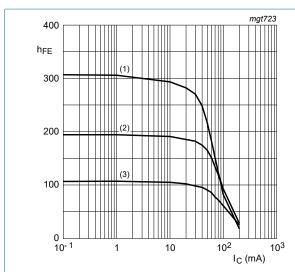
Fig. 3. Transient thermal impedance from junction to ambient as a function of pulse duration; typical values

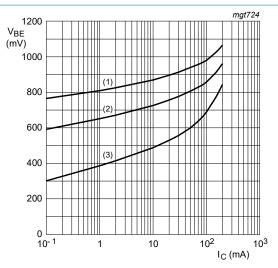

Fig. 4. BC847AQB-Q: DC current gain as a function of collector current; typical values



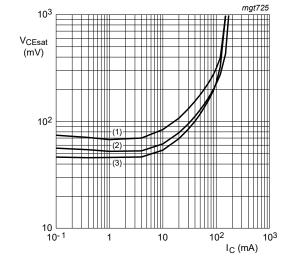

Fig. 5. BC847AQB-Q: Base-emitter voltage as a function of collector current; typical values



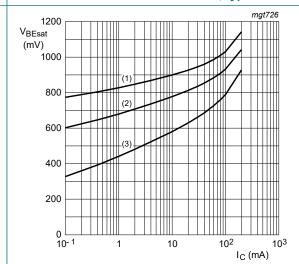

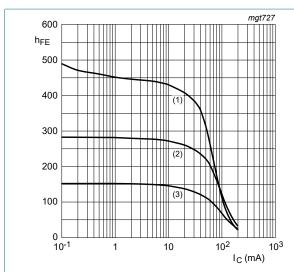

Fig. 7. BC847AQB-Q: Base-emitter saturation voltage as a function of collector current; typical values



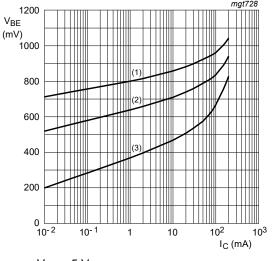

Fig. 8. BC847BQB-Q: DC current gain as a function of collector current; typical values



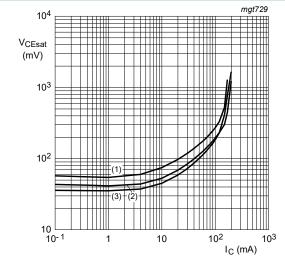

Fig. 9. BC847BQB-Q: Base-emitter voltage as a function of collector current; typical values



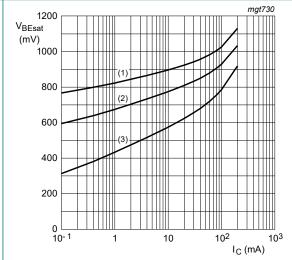

Fig. 10. BC847BQB-Q: Collector-emitter saturation voltage as a function of collector current; typical values



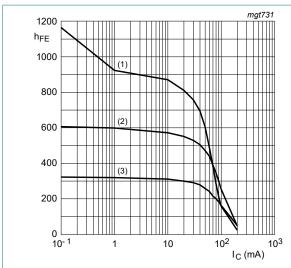

Fig. 11. BC847BQB-Q: Base-emitter saturation voltage as a function of collector current; typical values



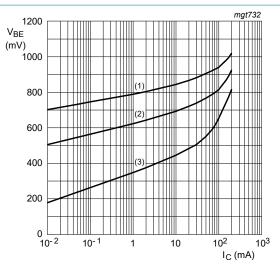

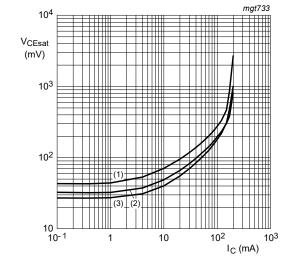

Fig. 13. BC847CQB-Q: Base-emitter voltage as a function of collector current; typical values



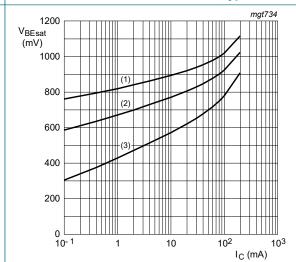

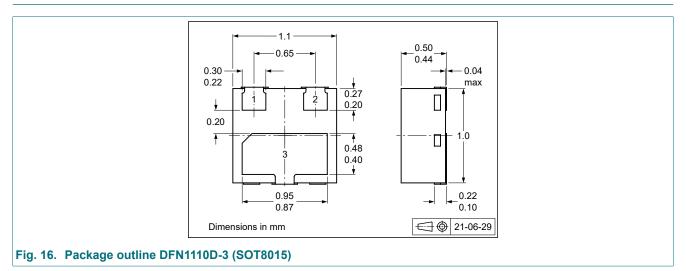

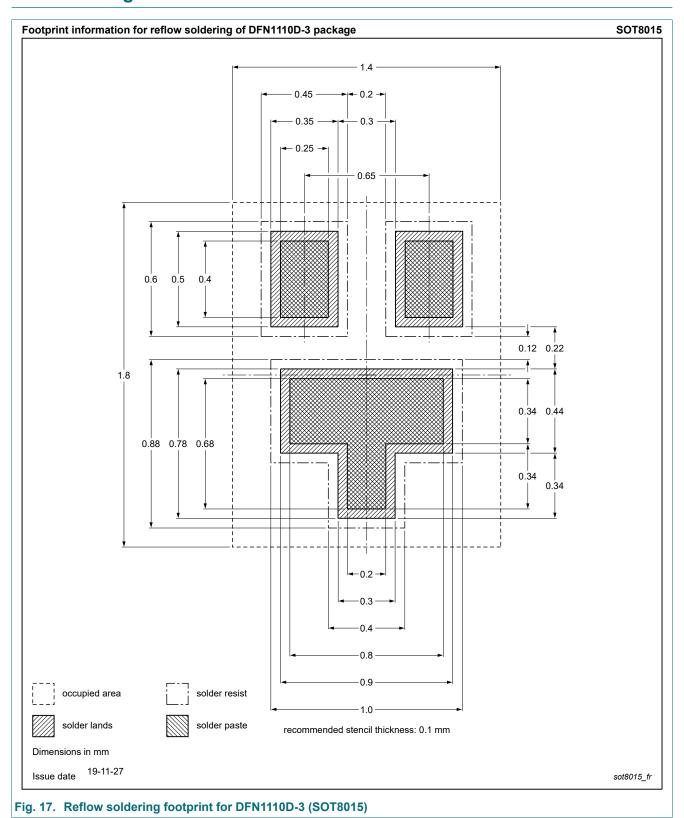
