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





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


Fig. 4. DC current gain as a function of collector current; typical values




Fig. 6. Base-emitter voltage as a function of collector current; typical values






Fig. 5. Collector current as a function of collectoremitter voltage; typical values

Fig. 7. Base-emitter saturation voltage as a function of collector current; typical values





Fig. 8. Collector-emitter saturation voltage as a function of collector current; typical values





Fig. 9. Collector-emitter saturation voltage as a function of collector current; typical values




Fig. 11. Collector-emitter saturation resistance as a function of collector current; typical values


