


Fig. 1. Transient thermal impedance from junction to ambient as a function of pulse duration; typical values





Fig. 2. Transient thermal impedance from junction to ambient as a function of pulse duration; typical values



Fig. 4. Reverse current as a function of reverse voltage; typical values





Fig. 5. Diode capacitance as a function of reverse voltage; typical values









Fig. 10. Average forward current as a function of solder point temperature; typical values






Fig. 11. Derated maximum reverse voltage as a function | Fig. 12. Derated maximum reverse voltage as a function of junction temperature; typical values

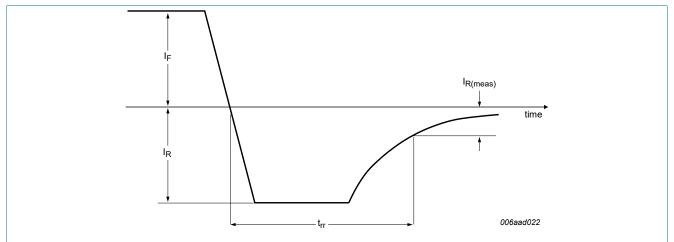


Fig. 14. Reverse recovery definition; step recovery




Fig. 15. Reverse recovery definition; ramp recovery





Fig. 16. Forward recovery definition




