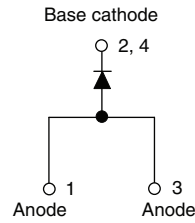
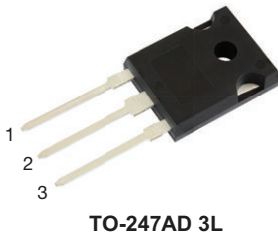

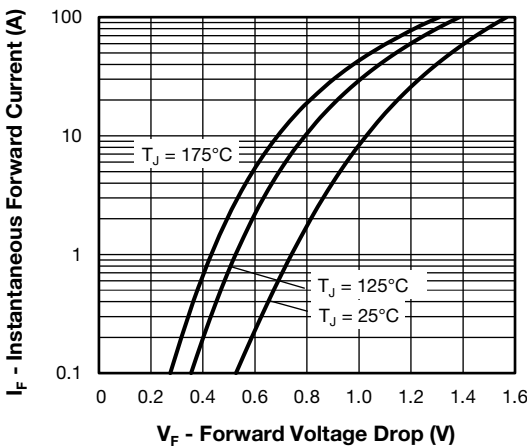


Fig. 1 - Typical Forward Voltage Drop Characteristics

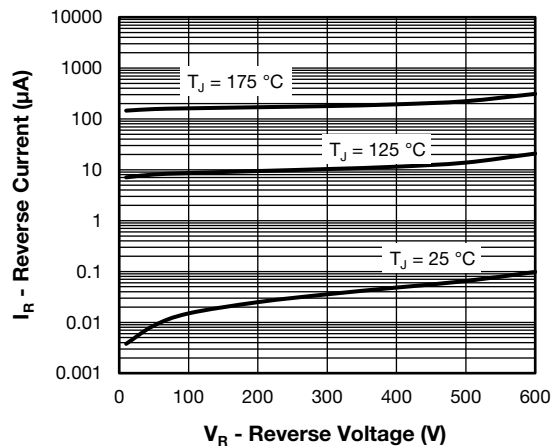


Fig. 2 - Typical Values of Reverse Current vs. Reverse Voltage

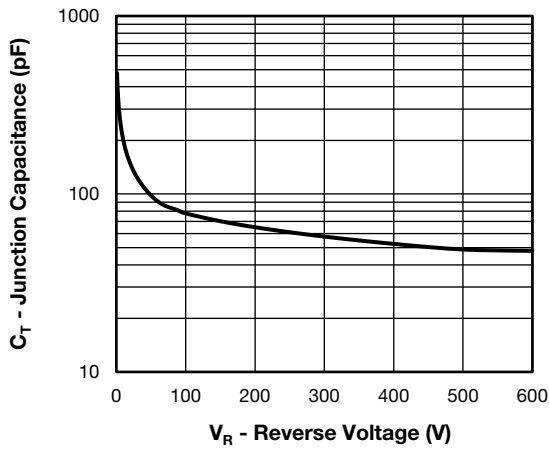


Fig. 3 - Typical Junction Capacitance vs. Reverse Voltage

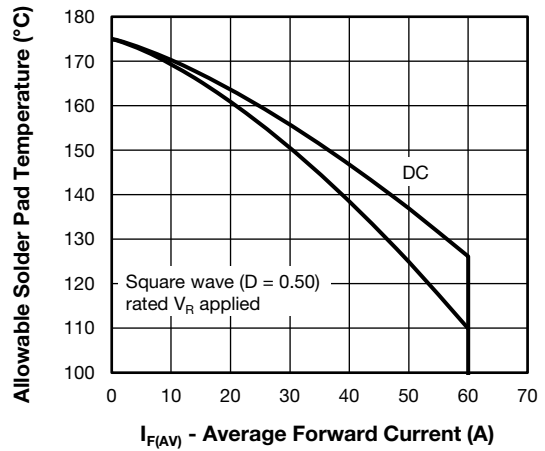


Fig. 4 - Maximum Allowable Case Temperature vs. Average Forward Current

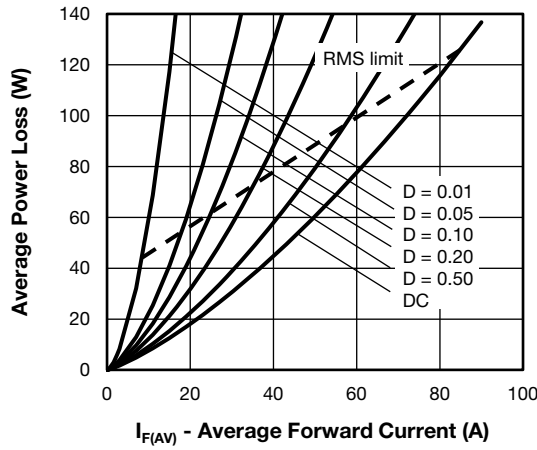


Fig. 5 - Average Power Loss vs. Average Forward Current

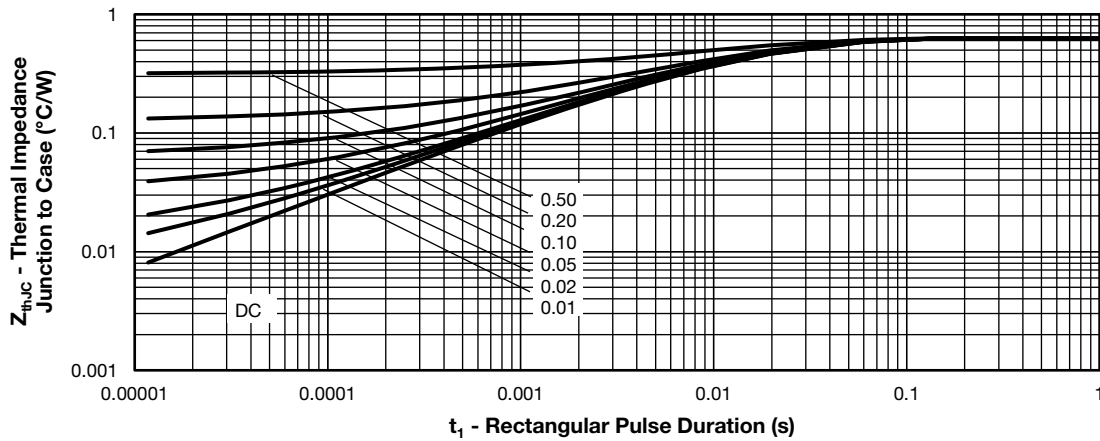


Fig. 6 - Thermal Impedance  $Z_{thJC}$  Characteristics

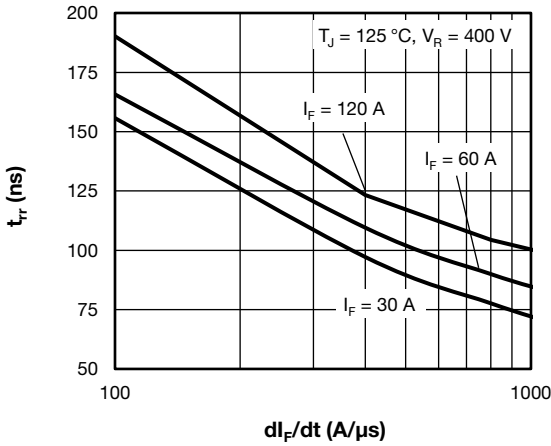


Fig. 7 - Typical Reverse Recovery Time vs.  $di/dt$

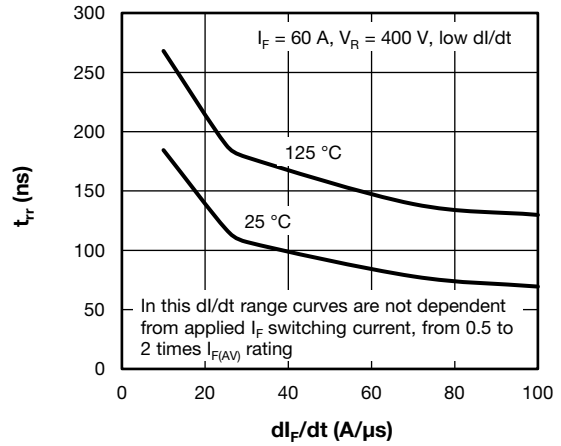


Fig. 10 - Typical Reverse Recovery Time vs.  $di/dt$

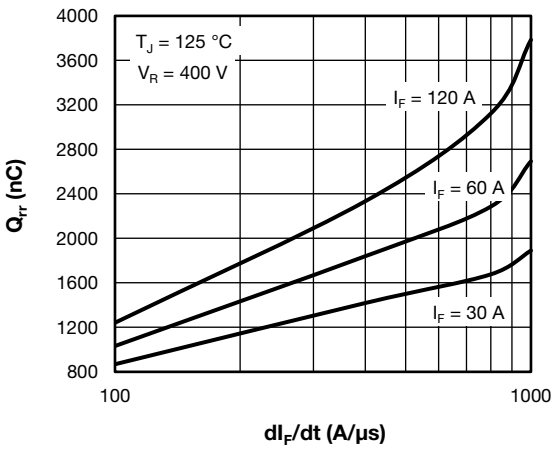


Fig. 8 - Typical Reverse Recovery Charge vs.  $di/dt$

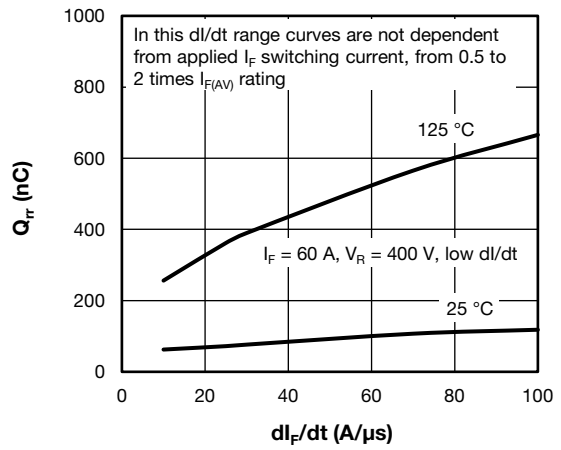


Fig. 11 - Typical Reverse Recovery Charge vs.  $di/dt$

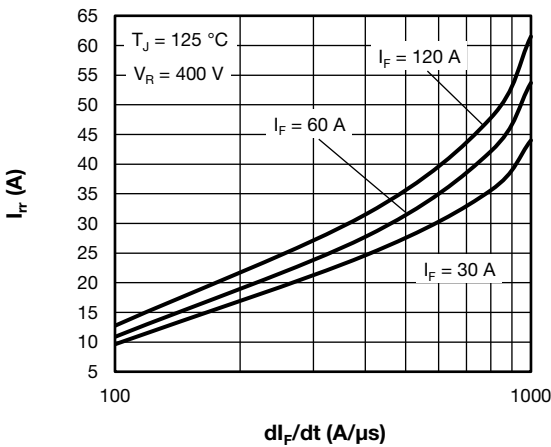


Fig. 9 - Typical Reverse Recovery Current vs.  $di/dt$

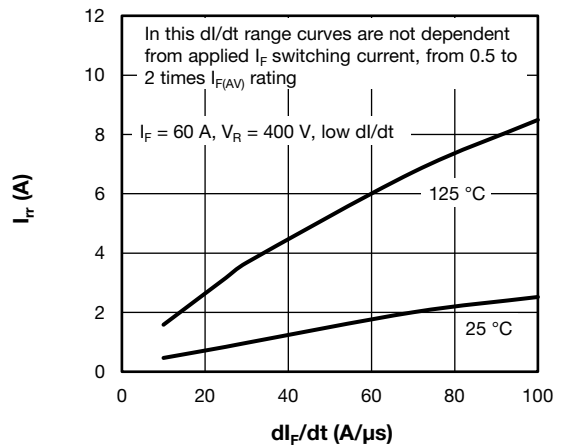


Fig. 12 - Typical Reverse Recovery Current vs.  $di/dt$

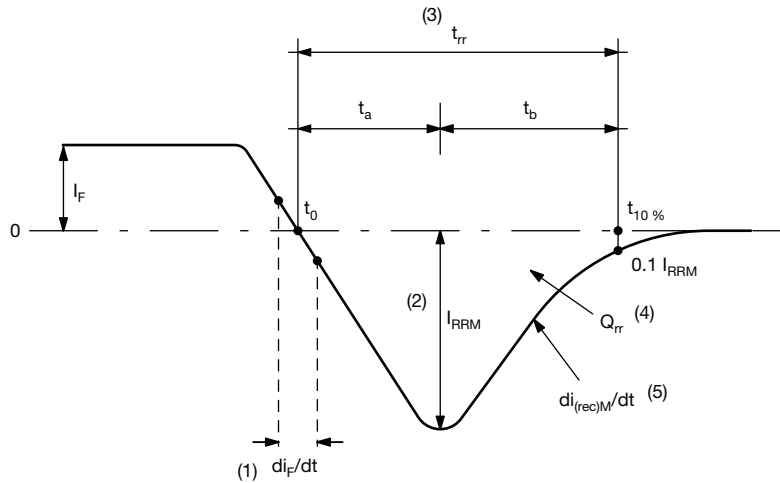


Fig. 13 - Reverse Recovery Waveform and Definitions

**Notes**
