

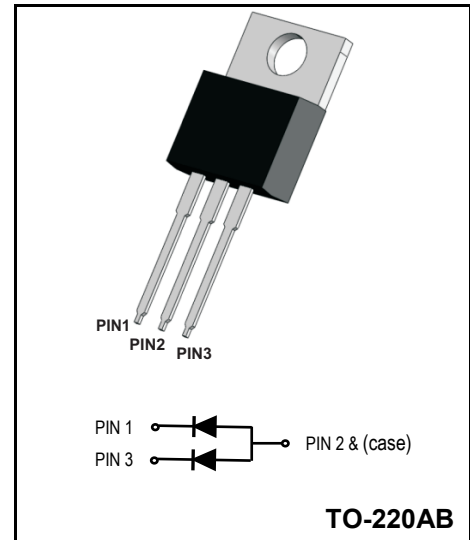

FIG. 1 - TYPICAL FORWARD CURRENT DERATING CURVE

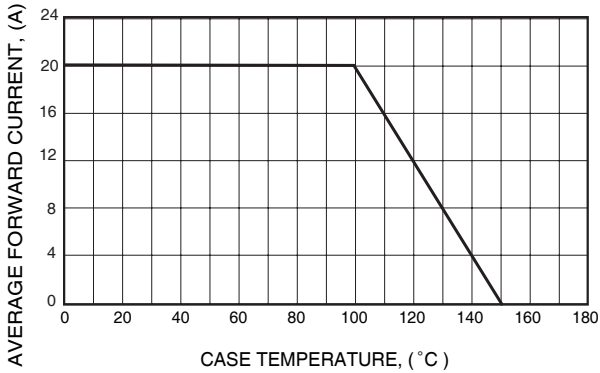


FIG. 3 - MAXIMUM NON-REPETITIVE FORWARD SURGE CURRENT

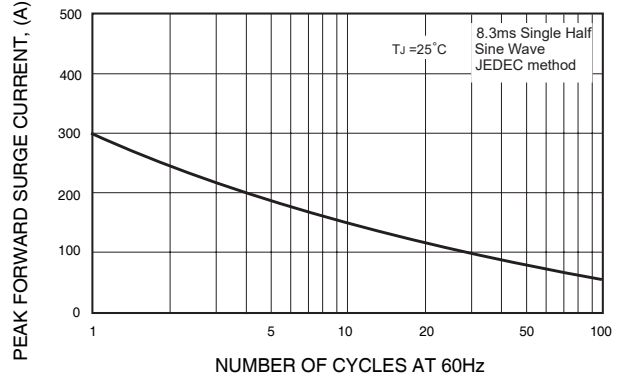


FIG. 4 - TYPICAL REVERSE CHARACTERISTICS

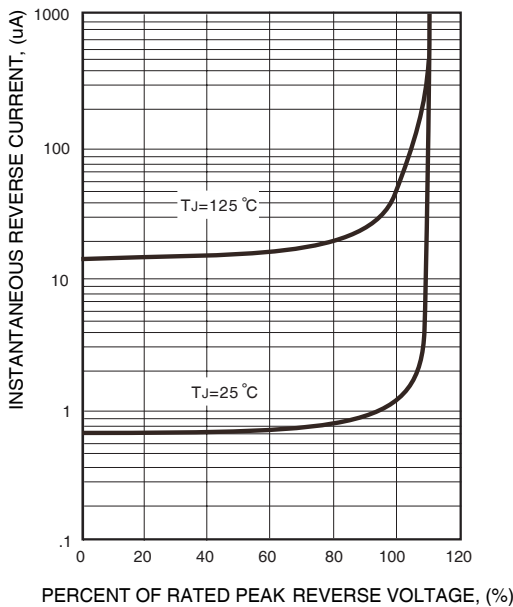


FIG. 2 - TYPICAL INSTANTANEOUS FORWARD CHARACTERISTICS

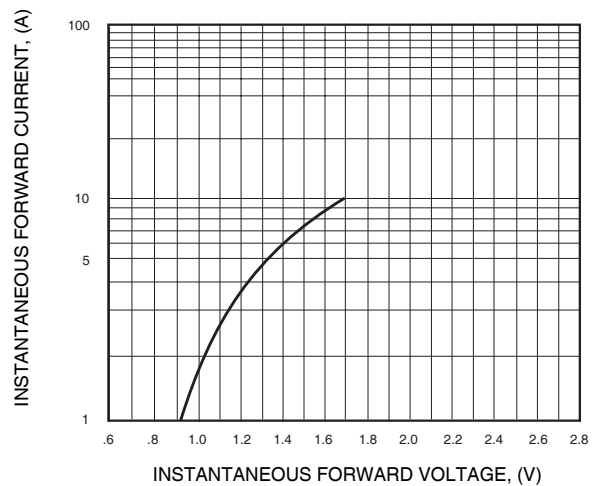
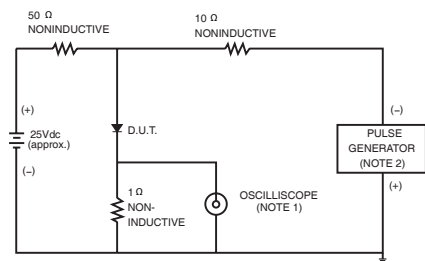
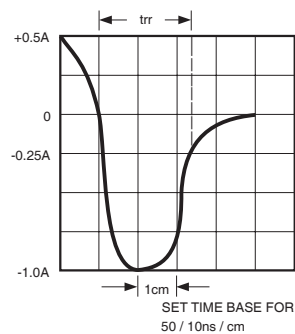


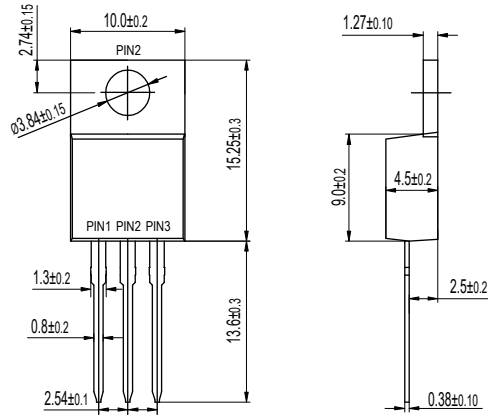
FIG. 6- TEST CIRCUIT DIAGRAM AND REVERSE RECOVERY TIME CHARACTERISTICS
